Abstract

This book covers Greek policy in the Mediterranean from 1950 to 2004. Chapter 1 focuses on Greek diplomacy in the 1940s, which includes World War II, the Greek Civil War and the beginning of the Cold War. Chapters 2 and 3 analyse Greek-Arab relations and Greece's stance on the Palestinian issue, while chapters 4 and 5 focus on the Cyprus issue, the Turkish invasion of Cyprus and Greek-Turkish relations and the Cyprus problem up to 2004 (the Annan Plan and Cyprus' accession to the EU). The study is addressed to the general reader, who wishes to learn about Greece's policy in its regional environment in the last century, but also to specialists in the fields of history, political science and international relations, in order to delve further into issues of Greek foreign policy. Lecturers, students, scholars and specialists can find in this book the necessary material to understand concepts and issues related to foreign policy, regional conflicts, foreign influence and involvement, and local particularities.
