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## Abstract

Health and welfare professionals encounter individuals and families with substance use or abuse problems very often in their clinical practice. The serious dimensions that the phenomenon of addiction has taken worldwide and also in our country, require from health and welfare professionals to set up an effective management strategy for the problems of substance use and abuse they face every day. The academic textbook "Caring for the family with addiction problems" is an evidence-based academic textbook that aims to inform and awareness among health and welfare students/professionals on issues of family outreach and interventions. It, also, aims at the continuing education of health and welfare professionals on issues related to addiction and family burden including family violence as well as the training

and professional self-development of professionals who work or wish to work in the field of addictions.
